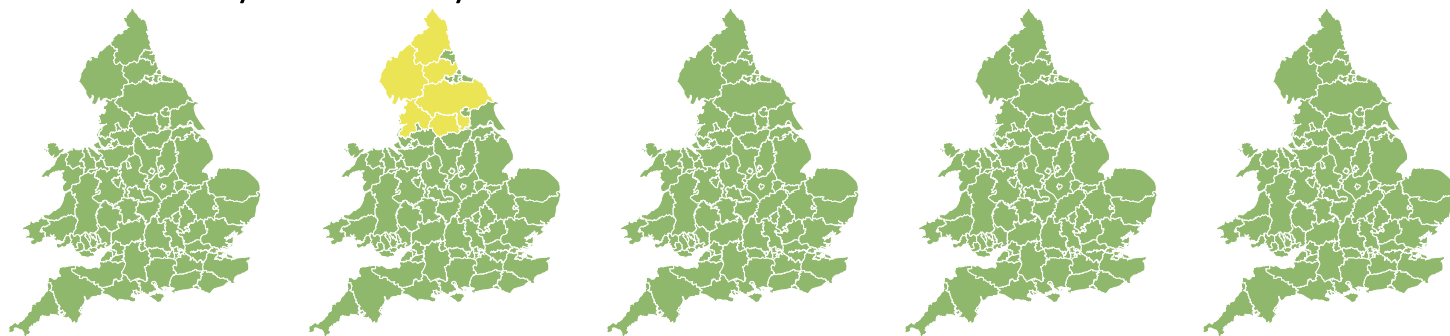

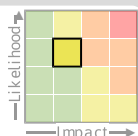
The flood risk is LOW tomorrow (Saturday).

RISK AREA A

Impact **MINOR**

Likelihood **MEDIUM**



Source Surface

Likely duration 1 Day

Heavy rain leading to minor surface water flood impacts.

RISK AREA B

Impact **MINOR**

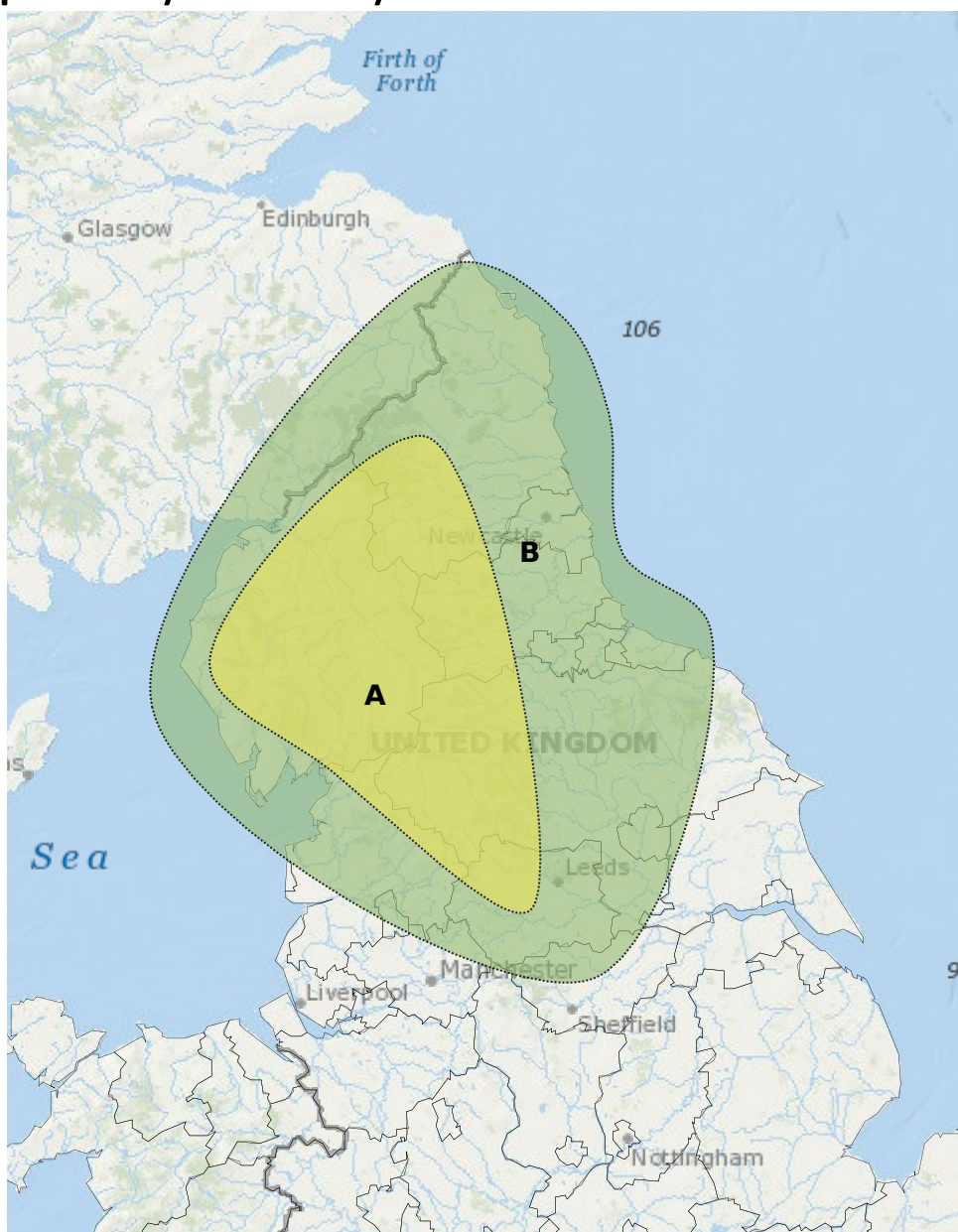
Likelihood **LOW**



Source River

Likely duration 1 Day

Heavy rain may lead to localised minor river flood impacts.



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Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

Persistent and sometimes heavy rain later tonight and tomorrow across upland parts of the north of England is expected to lead to minor surface water flooding impacts (Risk Area A).



Rivers

Persistent and sometimes heavy rain later tonight and tomorrow across upland parts of the north of England may lead to some localised minor river flooding impacts (Risk Area B). On Sunday, some rivers continue to respond to Saturday's rainfall, bringing a low likelihood of minor impacts for the City of York.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days. This is despite some large waves at times over the weekend and into next week.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
