Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

Some heavy rain today could lead to localised minor river flooding impacts across parts of central England as rivers respond through the rest of today (Sunday) and into Monday morning. There is a very low likelihood of these impacts which are dependent on the heaviest rain falling over the most sensitive locations in the Midlands. Despite periods of heavy rainfall at times today and through the rest of this week, the river flood risk is VERY LOW throughout.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW throughout, despite strong winds and large waves bringing the potential for isolated instances of spray and wave overtopping along the coasts of the south-west of England and Wales from today (Sunday) until Tuesday.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW throughout, despite periods of heavy rainfall at times.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
