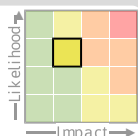

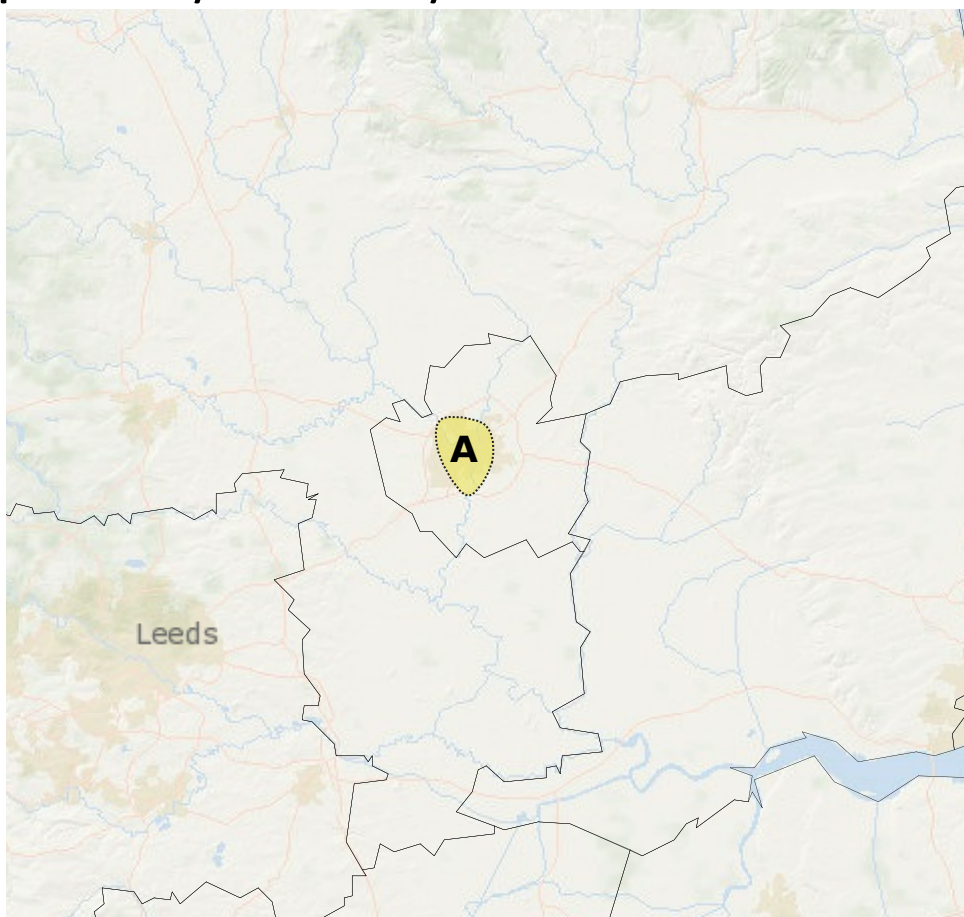

Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW for central parts of the City of York today (Thursday) and tomorrow (Friday). Rivers levels are expected to be high through Thursday and into Friday morning after recent heavy rainfall and snowmelt. This may lead to minor impacts, but to localised areas that are prone to flooding and therefore there is routine operational activity to this flood risk for this time of year.

Elsewhere and at all other times the river flood risk is VERY LOW.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
