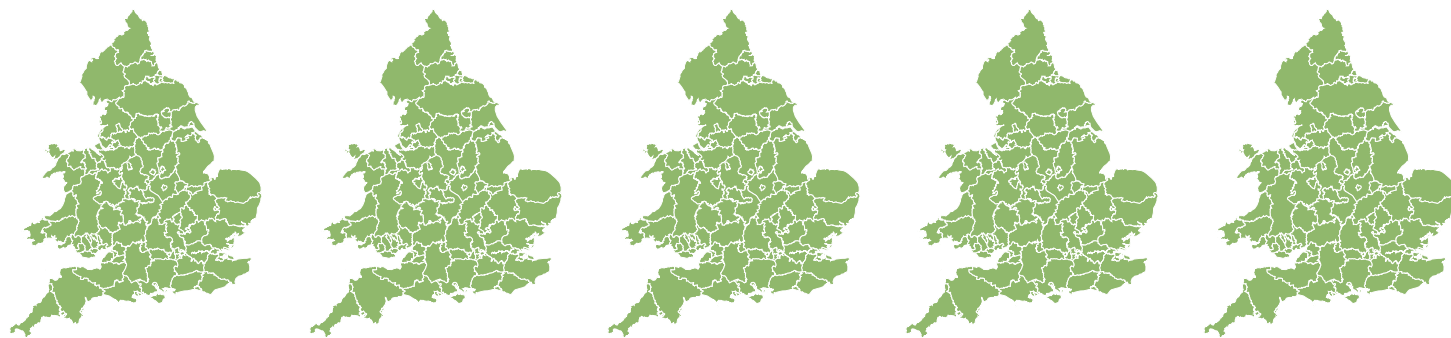

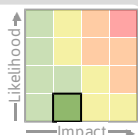
Local minor surface water flooding impacts across parts of England and Wales on Thursday are possible but not expected.

Impact **MINOR**

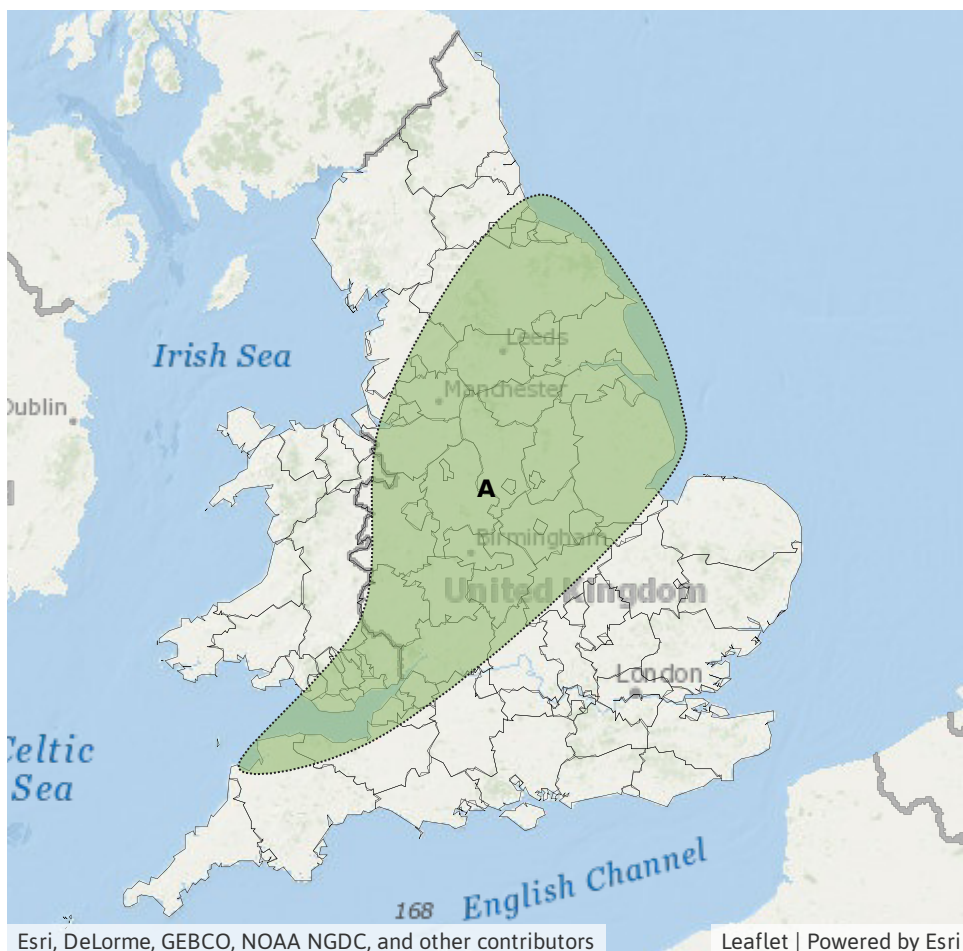
Likelihood **VERY LOW**

Likely duration 1 Day

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Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days. Some local minor surface water flooding impacts today (Thursday) are possible but not expected. Any impacts will result from heavy showers which may align during the afternoon and evening giving elevated totals locally.



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days. Levels on some rivers in North Yorkshire will continue to rise today following rainfall overnight and again later today over the North York Moors. Flood impacts here are expected to be minimal.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
