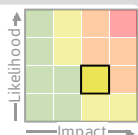

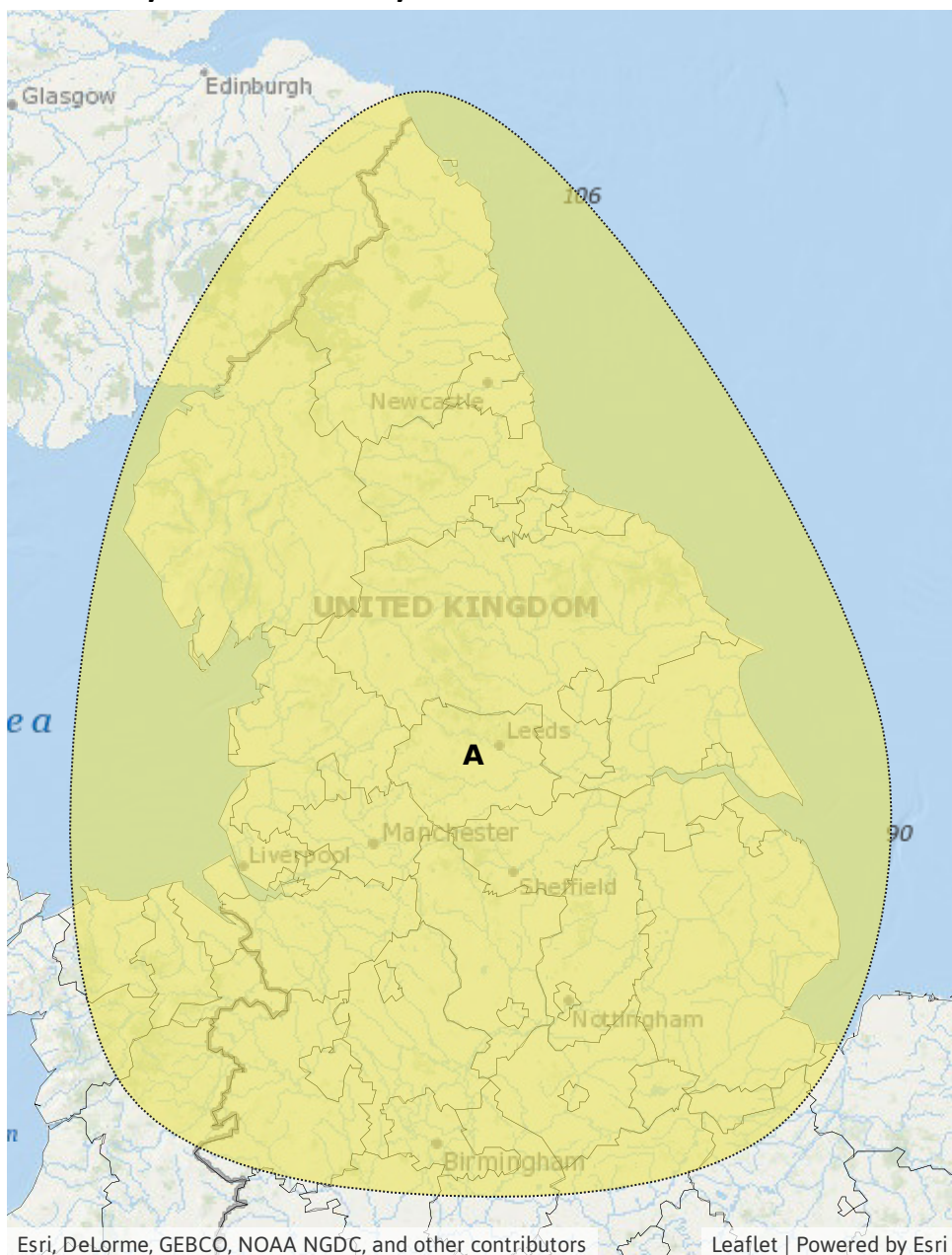

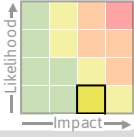

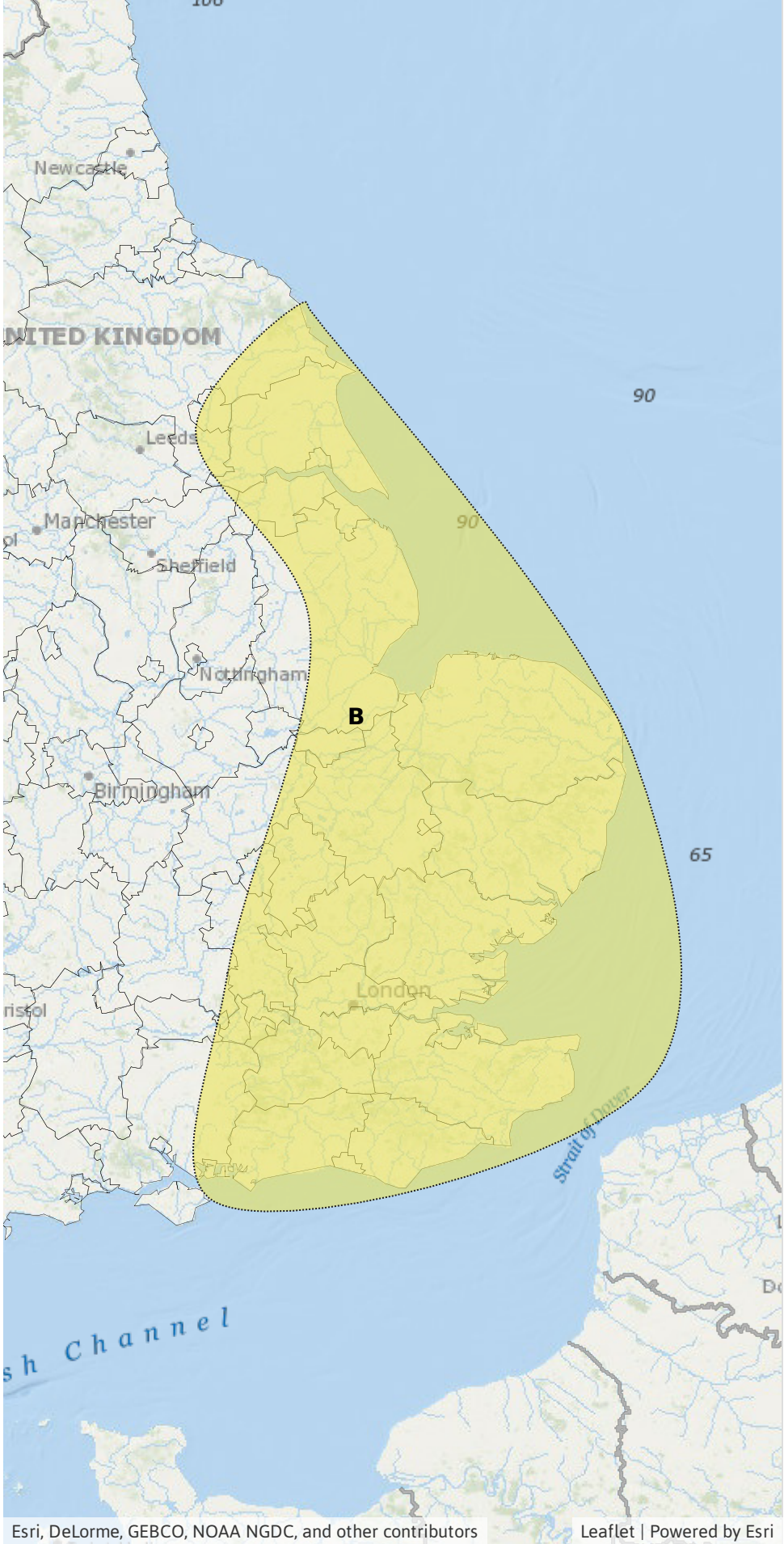

Surface water

Isolated significant surface water flooding impacts are possible during today (Wednesday) and overnight into Thursday morning. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Map 1.

Isolated significant surface water flooding impacts are also possible but not expected across parts of central, southern and eastern England on Thursday due to thundery outbreaks of rain. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Map 2. Urban areas are most at risk.



Rivers

Isolated significant river flooding impacts are possible during today (Wednesday) and overnight into Thursday morning. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Map 1. Any impacts are expected to be isolated and restricted to urban rivers and other fast responding watercourses.

Isolated significant river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected across parts of central, southern and eastern England on Thursday due to thundery outbreaks of rain. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Map 2. Urban areas are most at risk.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
