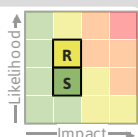

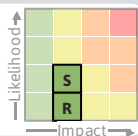

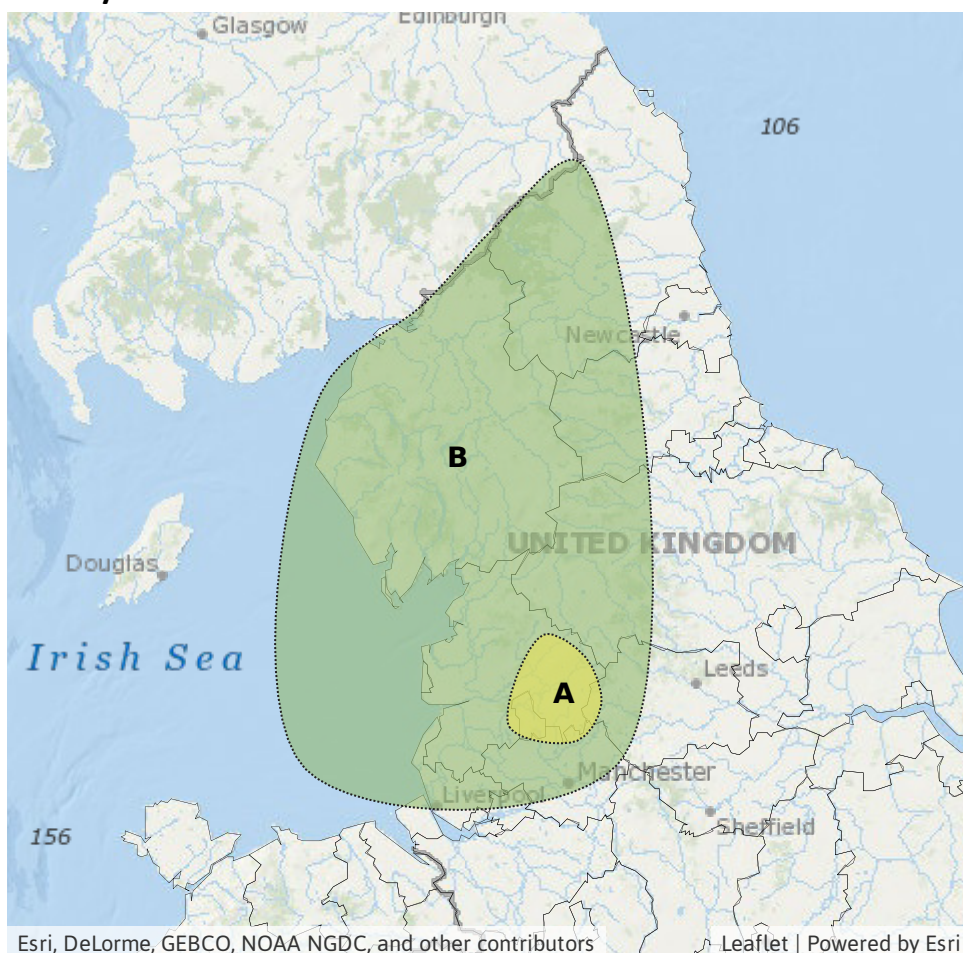

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Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW for Tuesday. Isolated minor impacts are probable on Tuesday from heavy rain in the north west of England. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Map 1.

At other times the river flood risk is VERY LOW though minor and localised impacts are possible on Wednesday and possible but not expected on Thursday and Friday from potentially heavy and thundery rain across much of England and Wales when there is the potential for further heavy rain and thundery downpours to cause rapid river responses especially in small and urban areas across England and Wales.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor impacts are possible on Tuesday and Wednesday from potentially heavy and thundery rain. Refer to Specific Area of Concern Maps 1 and 2.

Minor impacts are also possible, but not expected on Thursday and Friday when there is the potential for further heavy rain and thundery downpours to cause surface water flooding especially in urban areas across England and Wales.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days despite a period of high astronomical tides today (Monday).



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
