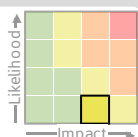
Localised significant surface water and river flooding impacts are possible but not expected across parts of England and Wales during Tuesday evening and Wednesday.

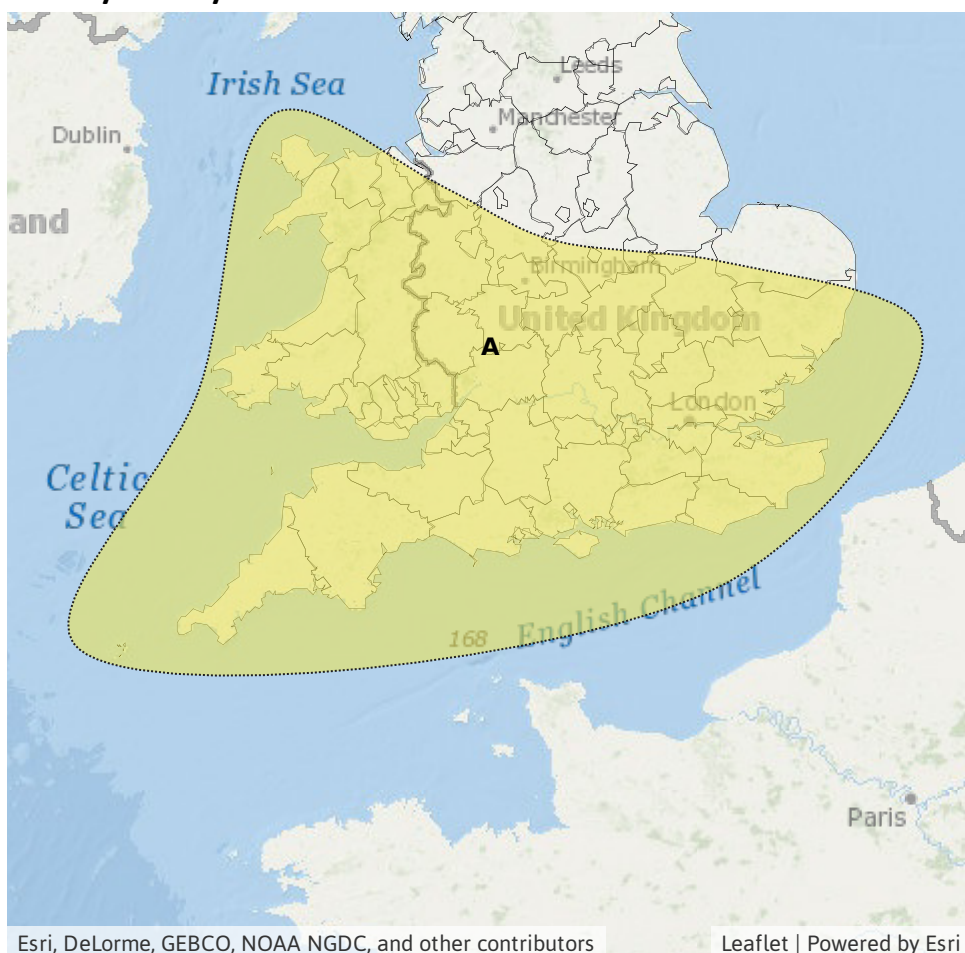

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Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW for Tuesday and Wednesday.

Localised significant surface water flooding impacts are possible, but not expected, in areas A and B of Specific Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2. This is as a result of locally torrential downpours from Tuesday evening and through Wednesday. The risk will be restricted to the north of both England and Wales by Wednesday afternoon. Urban areas are most at risk.

More widely across the rest of England and Wales on Wednesday minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected.



Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW for Tuesday and Wednesday.

Localised significant river flooding impacts are possible, but not expected, during Tuesday evening and through Wednesday in areas A and B of Specific Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2. This is as a result of locally torrential downpours with fast responding urban catchments most at risk. The risk will be restricted to the north of both England and Wales by Wednesday afternoon.

More widely across the rest of England and Wales on Wednesday minor river flooding impacts are possible but not expected.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
