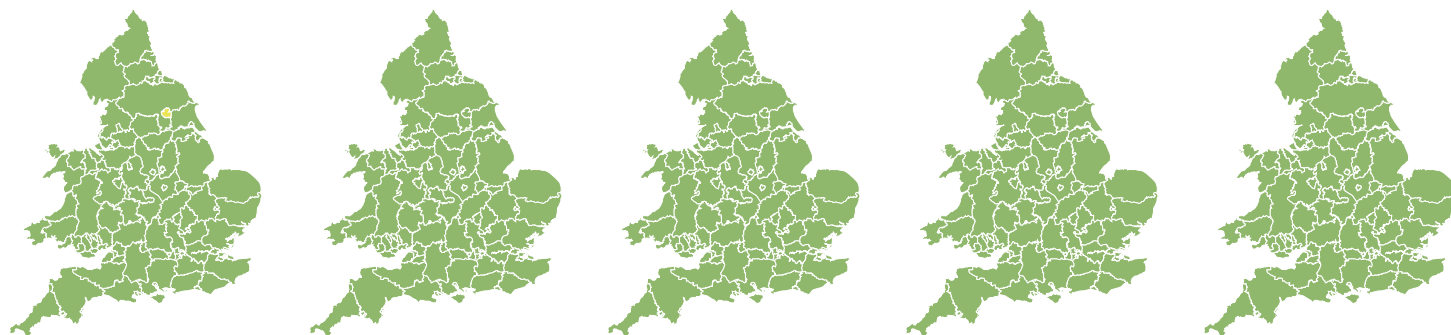

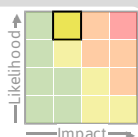
Low river flood risk as minor impacts are expected to continue around the River Ouse in York on Friday.

Impact **MINOR**

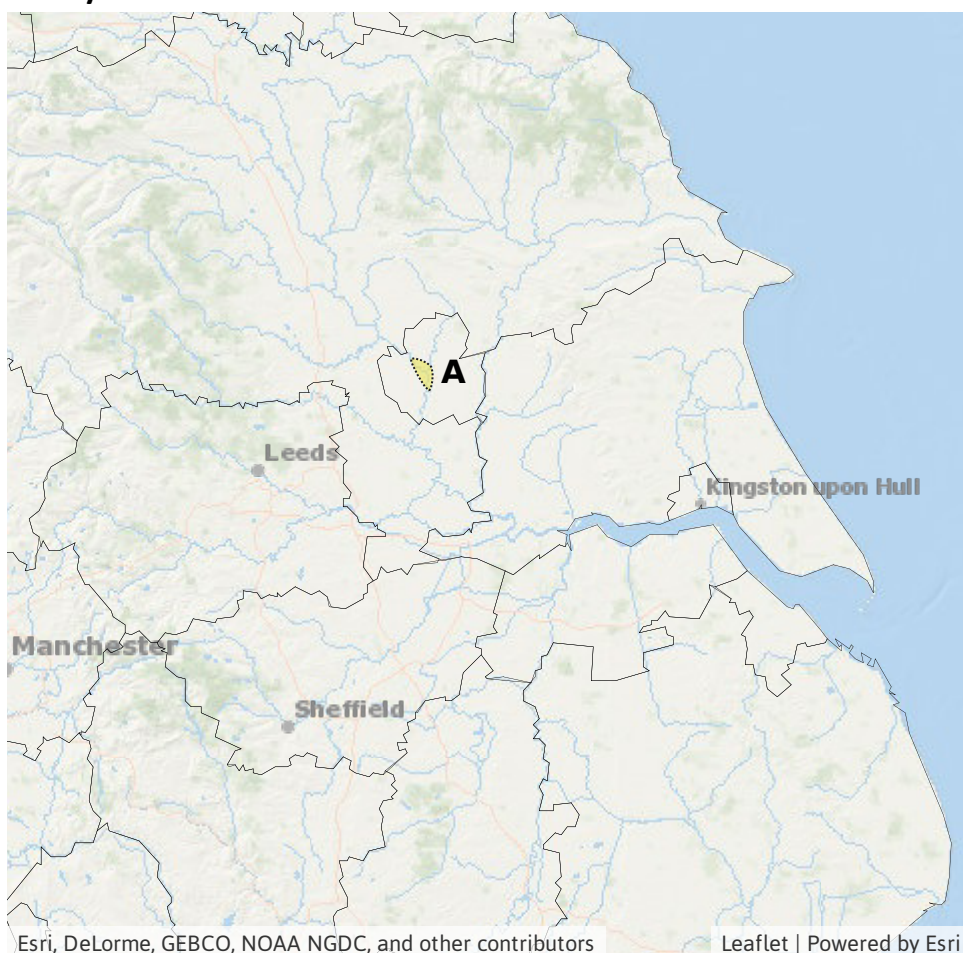
Likelihood **HIGH**

Flood impacts are expected to continue around the R.Ouse in York on Friday



Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

Minor river flood impacts are expected to continue in York today (Friday) as the River Ouse remains high. This leads to a LOW river flood risk for York reducing to VERY LOW from Saturday. See Area A in Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Elsewhere the river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days. Strong winds may lead to some wind blown spray and overtopping very locally along the Yorkshire coast at times, but no more than minimal coastal impacts are expected.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
