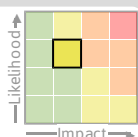
Minor surface water flooding impacts are probable for parts of south-west England and Wales today (Sunday). The overall flood risk is LOW.

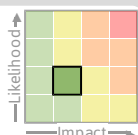

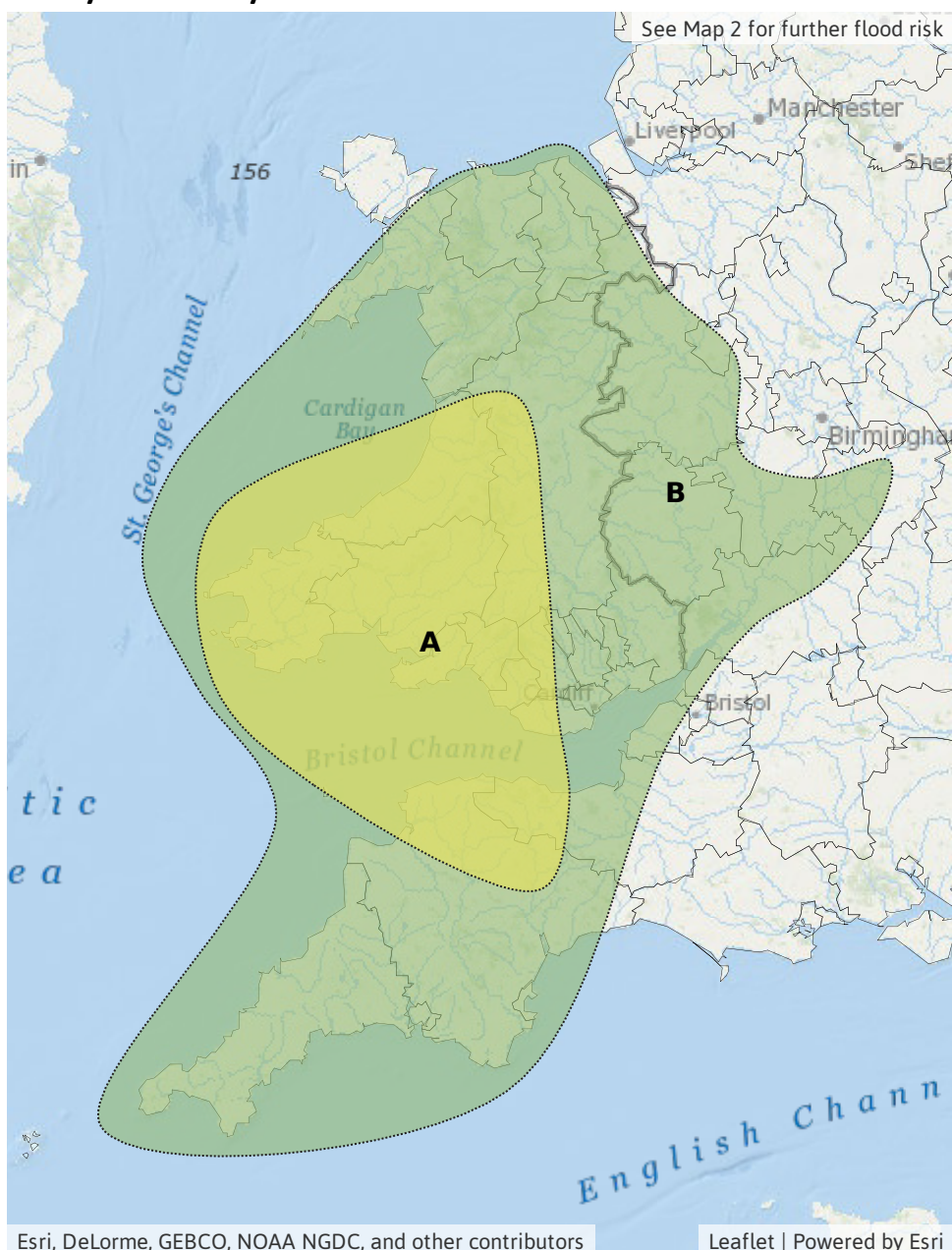

Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The overall surface water flood risk is LOW.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are probable in Area A and possible in Area B on Specific Areas of Concern Map 1 today (Sunday) due to heavy rain. In parts of Wales this may be combined with snowmelt.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected across other parts of England during this period, including across Wales and the north and west of England during Wednesday, as further heavy rain falls onto sensitive catchments.



Rivers

The overall river flood risk is VERY LOW.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible in Areas B and C on Specific Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2 today, tomorrow and into Tuesday. This is due to heavy rain falling on saturated catchments during Sunday. In parts of Wales and the Midlands this may be combined with snowmelt.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible but not expected across other parts of England during this period, including across Wales and the north and west of England during Wednesday, as further rain falls onto sensitive catchments.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
