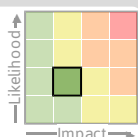
Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible for parts of the east coast of England on Thursday. The overall flood risk is VERY LOW. See end of FGS for 6-10 day forecast.

Some coastal flooding is possible as high tides, surge and large waves combine.

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Assessment of flood risk



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible along the east coast of England on Thursday as shown by Areas A on Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Localised minor coastal flooding impacts are possible but not expected along the north coast of Wales on Wednesday, and along other parts of the English and Welsh coastlines on Thursday and Friday.

High tides, large waves and some surge will combine to bring the potential for spray and wave overtopping in places.



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

River levels in the River Severn remain high but are continuing to recede.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

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6-10 day forecast

There remains potential during the early part of the 6-10 day forecast for unsettled and windy weather to coincide with high astronomical tides. This may lead to some coastal impacts.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
