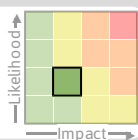

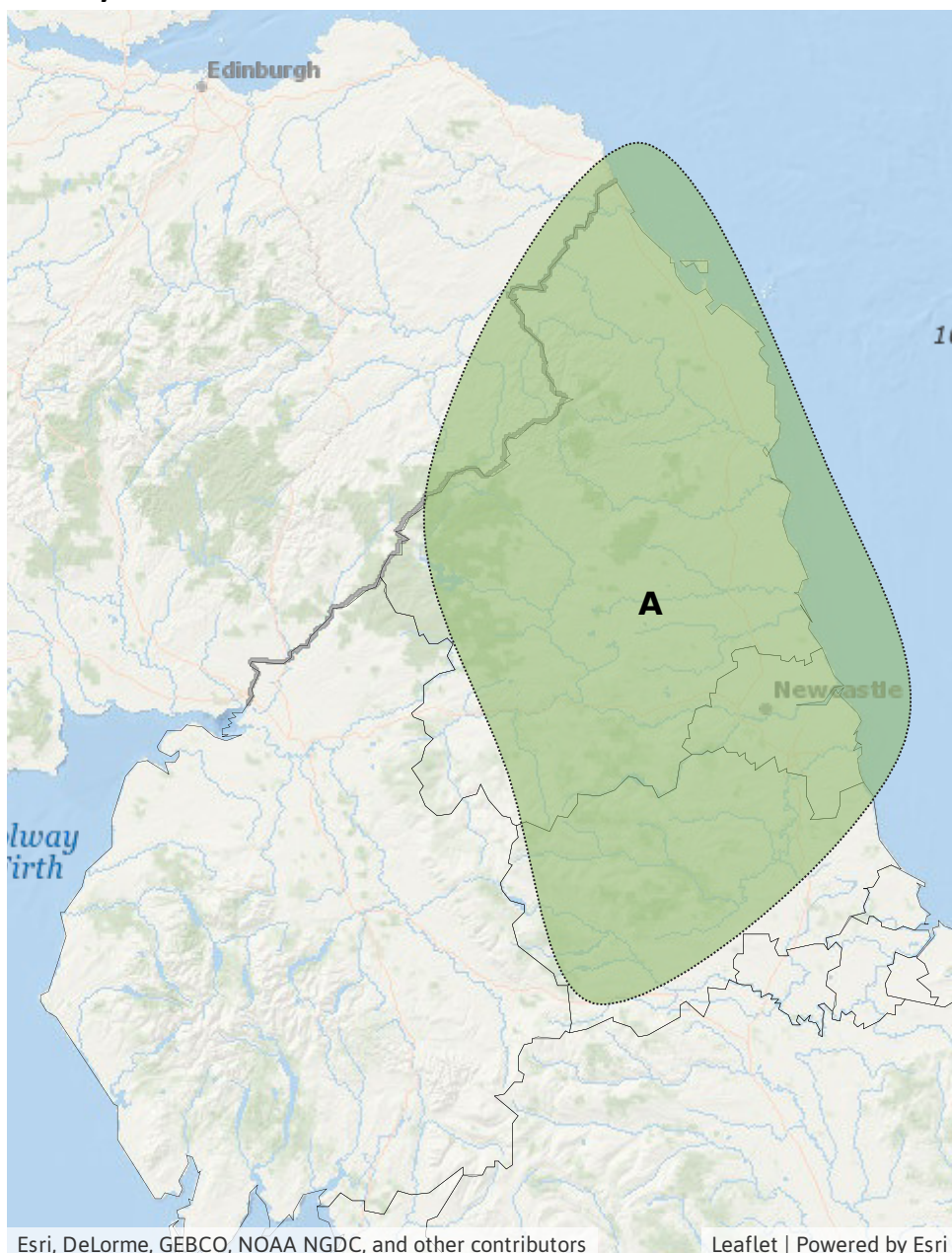

Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk remains VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible in parts of the north-east of England today (Tuesday) - see Area A in Specific Areas of Concern Map 1. This is due to a combination of earlier rain and snow melt.

Isolated minor surface water impacts may also affect other parts of England and Wales today due to ongoing snow melt.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Friday night and Saturday across the south-west of England and south Wales with some heavy and persistent rain possible there.



Rivers

The river flood risk remains VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible in parts of the north-east of England today (Tuesday) - see Area A in Specific Areas of Concern Map 1. This is due to a combination of heavy rain and snow melt which is already causing smaller, fast-responding rivers to rise.

Some localised minor river flooding is also possible but not expected today (Tuesday) in south-east Wales and other parts of England from combined snow melt and recent rainfall.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected on Saturday across the south-west of England and south Wales with some heavy and persistent rain expected there.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
