Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Much of any remaining snow is expected to melt during the daytime today (Tuesday).

Heavy rain is expected across the west of England and Wales late on Thursday and during Friday.

Although catchments remain sensitive, any river flooding impacts are expected to be minimal.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Much of any remaining snow is expected to melt during the daytime today (Tuesday).

Heavy rain is expected across the west of England and Wales late on Thursday and during Friday.

Although the ground is wet or saturated in many areas, any surface water flooding impacts are expected to be minimal.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

No expected risk to life
Isolated flooding of low-lying land and roads
Occasional waves and spray over promenades/sea walls
Difficult driving conditions on wet roads/through fords

MINOR

Risk to life for exposed and/or vulnerable individuals
Local flooding to land, roads and individual properties
Local short term disruption to travel
Local disruption to utilities and services

SIGNIFICANT

Danger to life from fast flowing, deep water/waves
Parts of communities flooded or inaccessible
Widespread or long duration travel disruption
Disruption to utilities and services

SEVERE

Danger to life from fast flowing, deep water/waves
Whole communities cut off or flooded
Widespread and long duration travel disruption
Widespread and prolonged loss of utilities and services
