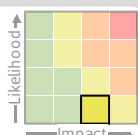

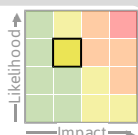

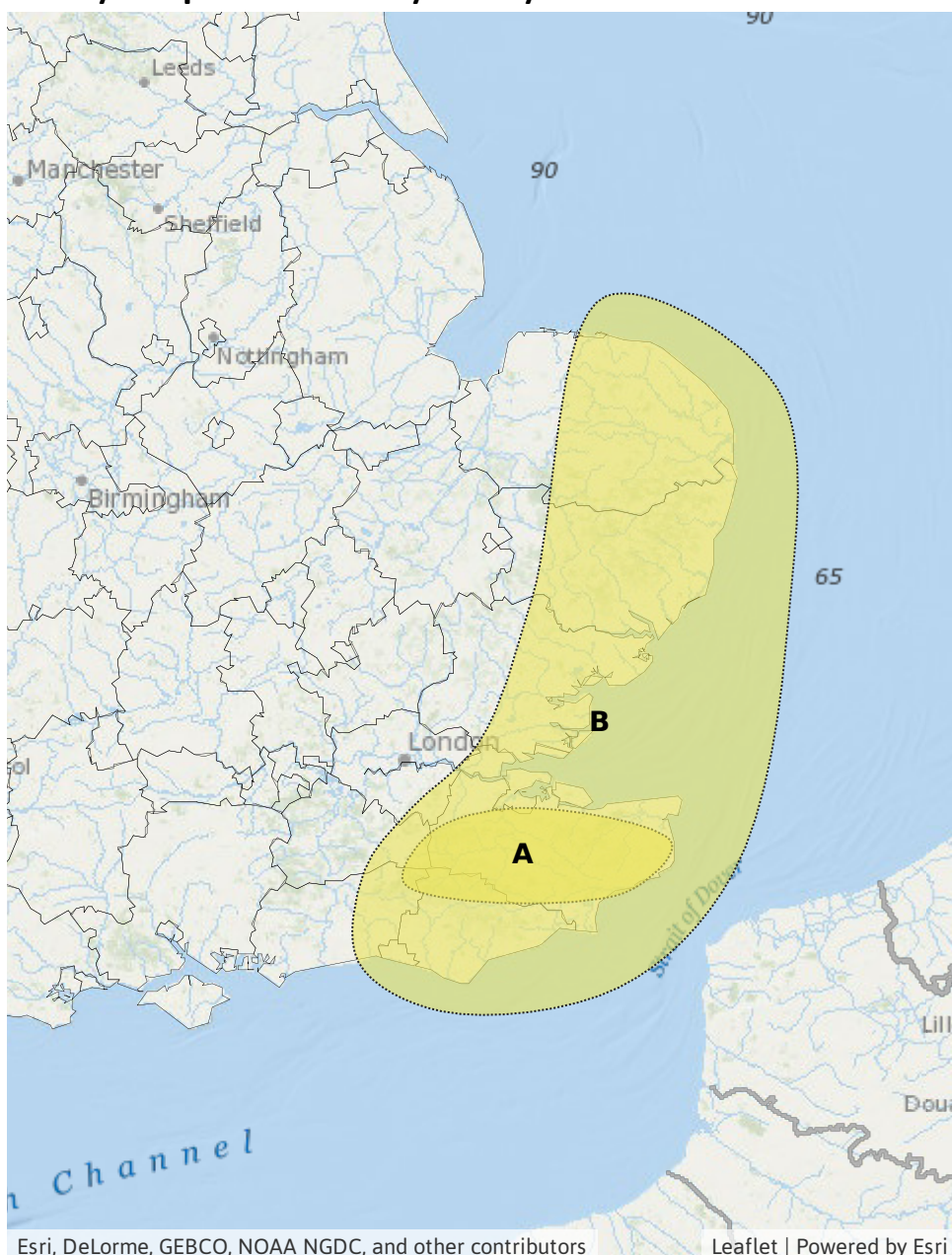

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Assessment of flood risk



Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW for today (Monday) and Tuesday.

Significant river flooding impacts are possible but not expected today (Monday) and through Tuesday in parts of the south-east of England. Minor impacts are probable more widely in the east of England. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Tidal reaches of some rivers are prone to flooding around the times of high tide, as well as small, fast responding urban watercourses.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW for Monday.

Significant surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected through today (Monday) for parts of the south-east of England. Minor impacts are probable more widely in the east of England due to widespread and locally heavy rain. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Strong northerly winds may exacerbate surface water impacts in some places due to blockages from wind blown debris.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

High tides will combine with strong winds and large waves today (Monday) along parts of the east and south-east coast of England. Localised minor coastal flooding impacts are possible for parts of the Yorkshire and Northumberland coastline and are possible but not expected elsewhere in the east and south-east.

Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Groundwater levels remain high across parts of Hampshire and West Berkshire, with some ongoing minimal impacts. Groundwater levels could rise further in Hampshire in response to the forecast rain but increased impacts are unlikely in the next five days.

Groundwater levels are high in North Yorkshire and the East Riding of Yorkshire. However, levels have begun to slowly decline. No groundwater flooding impacts are currently expected.

Groundwater levels continue to rise across West Berkshire in the Kennet catchment, although no impacts are expected in this period.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
