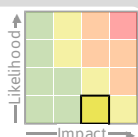

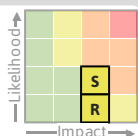

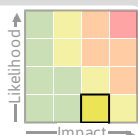

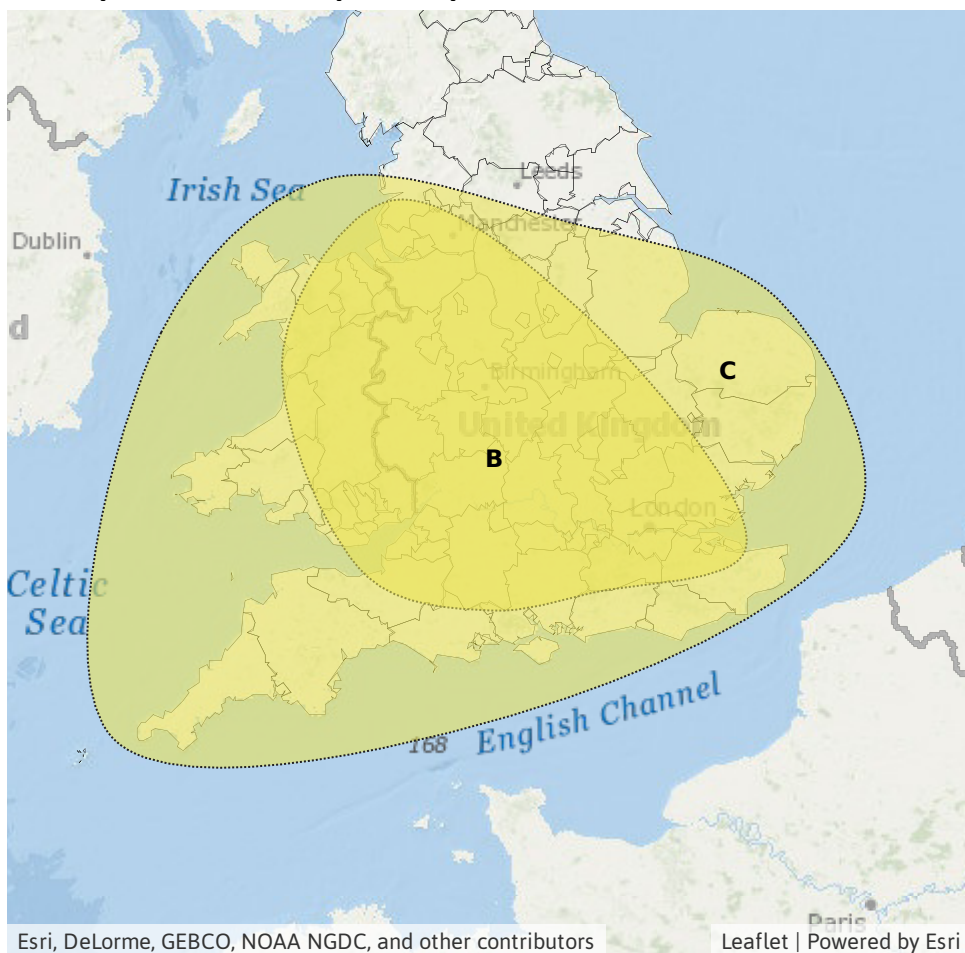

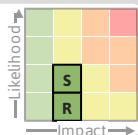


Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 - Tuesday 29 and Wednesday 30 May 2018

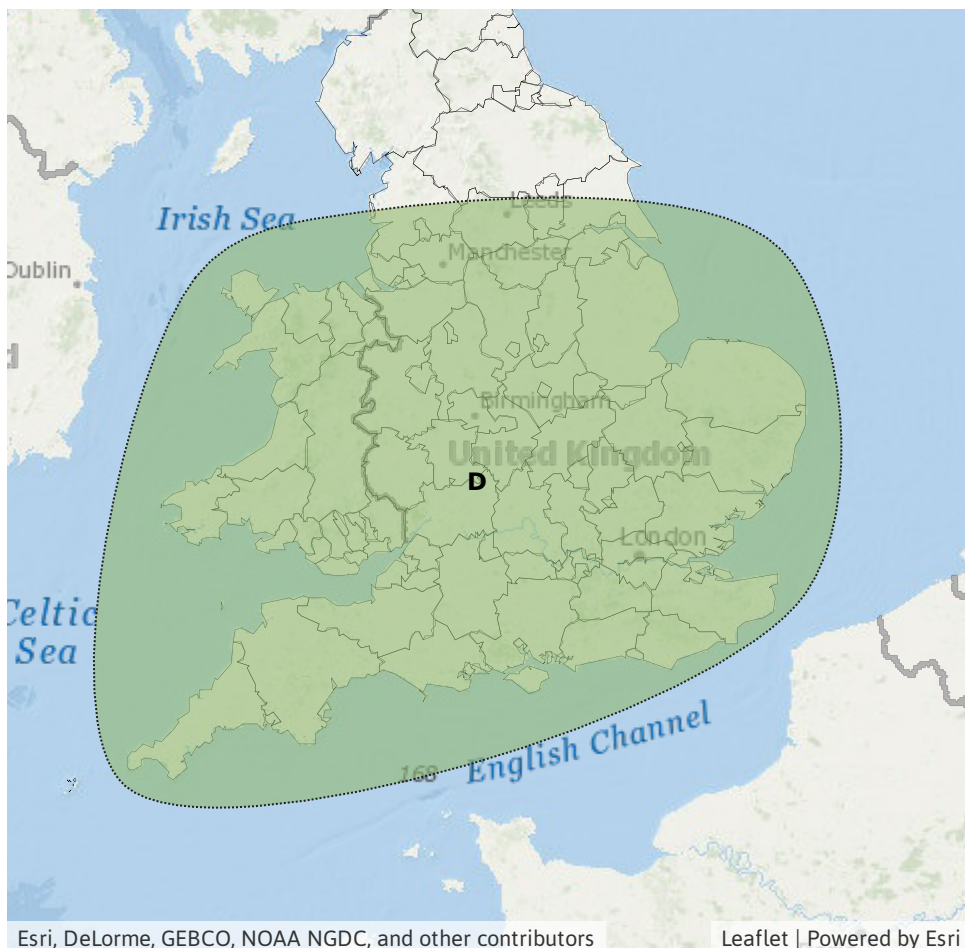

Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW for today (Saturday), Sunday and Monday.

Local significant surface water flooding impacts are possible at times for parts of England and Wales on Sunday and into early Monday morning, and possible but not expected this afternoon and evening. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2 for locations at risk. This is due to scattered heavy thunderstorms which may become heavier and more widespread on Sunday and early Monday. Strong gusts and hail may exacerbate flooding. Urban areas are most prone and not all locations within the risk areas will experience impacts.

Minor surface water impacts are also possible for other areas in Area D (Specific Areas of Concern Map 3) on Tuesday and Wednesday.



Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW for Saturday, Sunday and early Monday morning.

Local significant river flooding impacts are possible but not expected at times for parts of England and Wales on Saturday, Sunday and early Monday morning. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2 for locations at risk. This is due to scattered heavy thunderstorms which may become heavier and more widespread through the weekend. Fast responding and urbanised catchments are most at risk if they experience locally heavy downpours.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected on Tuesday and Wednesday (See Specific Areas of Concern Map 3).



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
