Minor surface water and river flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Saturday. The overall flood risk is VERY LOW.

Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not currently expected on Saturday, mainly for parts of central and northern England and also Wales. This is due to the potential for scattered heavy showers. Urban areas are most at risk.



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Local minor river flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Saturday, mainly in parts of central and northern England and also Wales. Small urban rivers and fast responding catchments are most at risk.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Strong to gale force winds today (Thursday) will lead to some surge, large waves, spray and wave overtopping for the north-west coast of England and parts of the Welsh coastline today. Some surge may also coincide with spring tides for parts of the Yorkshire coastline on Friday. Only minimal impacts are expected on both days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Flood risk matrix



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
