Local minor coastal/tidal flooding impacts are possible but not expected for parts of the north-east England coast on Tuesday and Wednesday. The overall flood risk is VERY LOW.

Assessment of flood risk



Coastal/Tidal

Local minor coastal/tidal flooding impacts are possible but not expected for parts of the north-east England coast on Tuesday and Wednesday. This is due to large waves and strong winds giving the potential for wave and spray over topping. The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days, despite locally heavy showers on Tuesday and Wednesday.



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Flood risk matrix



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
