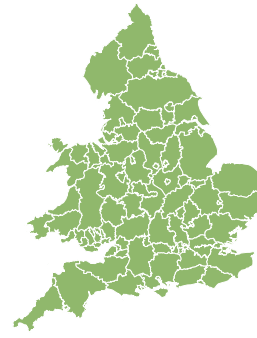

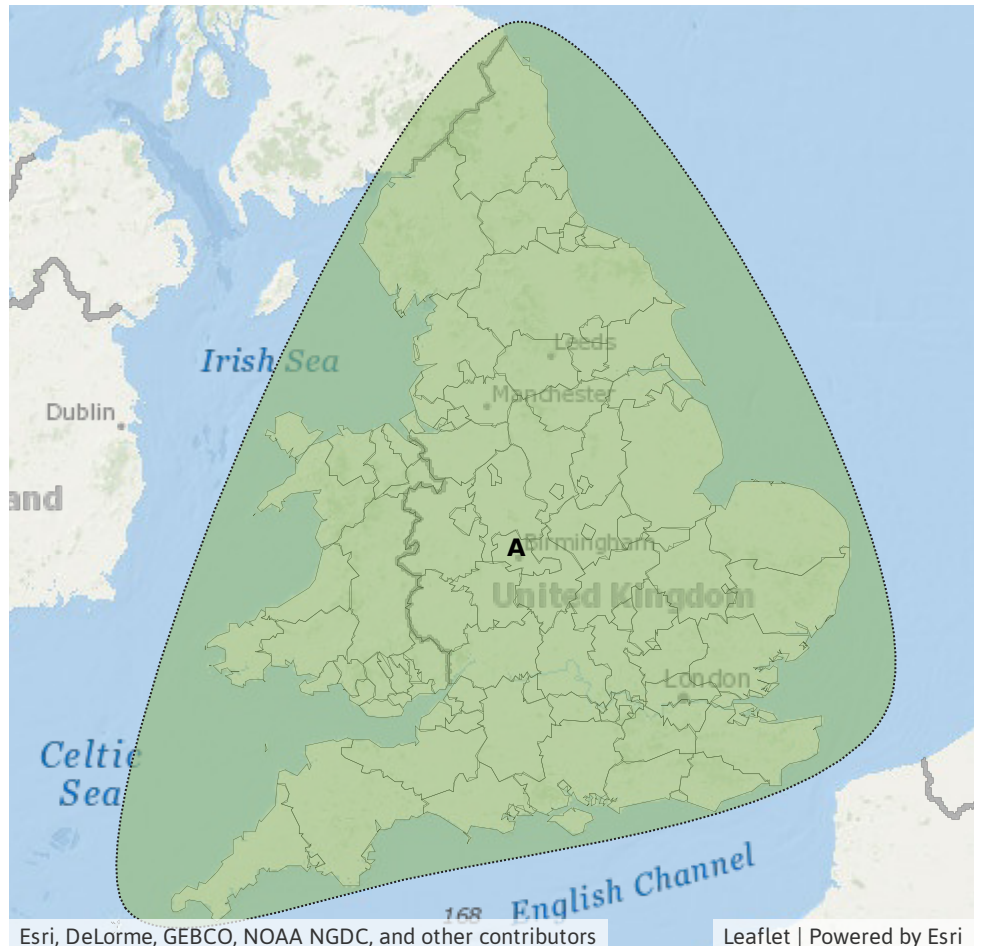
Surface water flooding impacts are possible from thunderstorms from Thursday night and more especially on Friday. The flood risk may escalate in the coming days as the area at risk becomes more refined. The overall flood risk is currently VERY LOW.

Urban areas most at risk from surface water flooding due to thunderstorms.



Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Local surface water flooding impacts are possible across parts of England and Wales from Thursday night and more especially during Friday. This is due to the chance of isolated heavy thunderstorms. On Friday in particular, the specific location of thunderstorms at this lead time is subject to a lot of uncertainty and the flood risk may escalate in the coming days as the area at risk becomes more refined.



Rivers

The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days, despite the chance of some locally heavy showers and thunderstorms on Thursday and Friday.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Flood risk matrix



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
