


Minor inland flooding impacts are probable over parts of England and Wales today (Wednesday) with surface water flooding impacts continuing over parts of the East and South East of England into early Thursday morning. The overall flood risk is LOW.



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### Assessment of flood risk

Surfa

Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW on Wednesday and early on Thursday morning.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are probable on Wednesday across parts of the England and Wales, and possible more widely across much of England and Wales. Minor surface water flooding impacts are also probable across parts of South East and East of England early on Thursday morning. This is due to the potential for a period of slow-moving heavy rain. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



The river flood risk is LOW on Wednesday.

Minor river flooding impacts are probable on Wednesday across parts Wales and Cumbria, and possible more widely across much of England and Wales. Minor river flooding impacts are also possible across parts of South East and East of England on Thursday morning. This is due to the potential for a period of slow-moving heavy rain. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps.



The coastal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.




The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

# Summary of potential impacts

### MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

#### MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

### SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

#### SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
