


Significant inland flooding impacts are probable in North East England on Friday and Saturday and possible but not expected in South East England on Friday and Saturday. The overall flood risk for England and Wales for the next five days is MEDIUM.


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Specific Areas of Concern Map 2 - Thursday 19 October 2023

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Assessment of flood risk



The river flood risk is MEDIUM.

Significnt river flooding impacts are probable across parts of North East England on Friday and Saturday.

Significant river flooding impacts are possible across other parts of the north of England from Thursday to Saturday and are possible but not expected across parts of East Anglian and South East England on Friday and Saturday. This is due to persistent and heavy rain affecting these areas. See Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible but not expected more widely across England and Wales from Thursday to Saturday, due to more localised, heavy rain.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW.

Significnt surface water flooding impacts are probable across parts of North East England on Friday and Saturday.

Significant surface water flooding impacts are possible across parts of the north of England from Thursday to Saturday and are possible but not expected across parts of East Anglian and South East England on Friday. This is due to persistent and heavy rain affecting these areas. See Areas of Concern Maps 1 and 2.

Localised minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected more widely across England and Wales on Thursday and Friday, and also in South Wales and the South of England on Wednesday, and in parts of the east of England on Saturday due to more localised, heavy rain.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible but not expected along the coasts of Yorkshire and North East of England on Friday and Saturday. Minimal coastal flooding impacts are possible along the coast of East England on Friday and Saturday.

This is due to a combination of large waves and wind-blown spray.



The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.


Flood Guidance Statement

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Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
