



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### Assessment of flood risk



The river flood risk is LOW.

Ongoing significant river flooding impacts from the Rivers Trent and Idle through parts of the Midlands today (Wednesday), reducing to minor impacts tomorrow and Friday. Ongoing minor flooding from the River Severn today until Friday. Ongoing minor river flooding impacts on the Isle of Wight and South East England today following heavy overnight rainfall. See Area of Concern Maps.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Thursday into Friday for parts of the East of England and East Midlands, on Friday into Saturday for parts of the south of Wales and south of England, and more widely across England and Wales later Saturday and into Sunday. This is due to heavy rain and showers across sensitive catchments.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is LOW on Sunday.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible on Friday and Saturday, and probable on Sunday for some south and west coasts of England and Wales. This is due to large waves and spring tides. High tide levels may also lead to minor impacts on the tidal reaches of the River Wye (e.g. at Brockweir in Gloucestershire). See Specific Areas of Concern maps.

Minor coastal impacts are possible but not expected along the coasts of North East and North West England and Yorkshire and the Humber, with minimal impacts possible from the Humber to Kent, due to storm surge and large waves.

Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Thursday into Friday for parts of the East of England and East Midlands, on Friday into Saturday for parts of the south of Wales and south of England, and more widely across England and Wales later Saturday and into Sunday. This is due to heavy rain and showers across sensitive catchments.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.


# Flood Guidance Statement

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## Summary of potential impacts

### MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

#### MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

#### SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

#### SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
