



Minor inland flooding impacts are possible in Wales and parts of England on Monday and Tuesday. Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible along parts of the coast of Wales and North West England on Monday. The overall flood risk is VERY LOW.

Specific Areas of Concern Map 1 - Monday 13 and Tuesday 14 November 2023














Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 - Sunday 12 to Thursday 16 November 2023

Assessment of flood risk



The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible in Wales and across parts of England on Monday and Tuesday (see Areas of Concern Map 1) and possible but not expected elsewhere following widespread and sometimes heavy rain associated with Storm Debi.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected from further rain across the South of England and London on Thursday.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible in Wales and across parts of England on Monday (see Areas of Concern Map 1) and possible but not expected elsewhere due to widespread and sometimes heavy rain associated with Storm Debi.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are also possible but not expected from further rain across the South of England and London on Thursday.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible around much of the coast of Wales and North West England on Monday due to Storm Debi bringing onshore gales and causing storm surge and large waves (see Areas of Concern Map 2). Impacts may include spray on low-lying roads and coastal promenades and isolated property flooding.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor groundwater flooding impacts are possible for the next five days across parts of Dorset and West Sussex (see Areas of Concern Map 3), and are possible but not expected in Wiltshire. This is due to recent heavy rainfall and on-going unsettled conditions.



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
