
### Specific Areas of Concern Map 1 - Sunday 21 and Monday 22 January 2024
















### Specific Areas of Concern Map 2 - Tuesday 23 to Thursday 25 January 2024







Further rain on Tuesday with river flooding possibly continuing into Wednesday.

#### Assessment of flood risk



The river flood risk is LOW for Sunday and Monday. Significant river flooding impacts are possible but not expected on Sunday and Monday in parts of Cumbria.

Minor river flooding impacts are probable for parts of Wales and the North of England on Sunday and Monday, and possible more widely across the North of England and Wales due to successive spells of heavy rain today (Sunday) and into Monday. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible across Wales and the North of England on Tuesday and Wednesday due to further widespread rain and may continue through York and on the River Severn from Tuesday to Thursday. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 2.



#### Surface water

The surface water flood risk is LOW for Sunday and Monday.

Spells of heavy rain today and tonight mean minor surface water flooding impacts are probable across Wales and the North of England, particularly North West England. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 1.

Further rain means minor surface water flooding is again possible across parts of Wales and the North of England on Tuesday.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



#### Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor impacts are possible across parts of the South of England and Yorkshire and the Humber.

#### Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible on parts of the west Dorset coast prone to south-westerly waves on Sunday and Monday.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible within the Norfolk and Suffolk Broads from Sunday to Thursday due to tide locking and on the adjacent coast on Wednesday and Thursday.



#### **Summary of potential impacts**

#### MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

#### **MINOR**

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

#### **SIGNIFICANT**

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

#### **SEVERE**

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
