










Specific Areas of Concern Map 2 - Monday 12 to Wednesday 14 February 2024




Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 - Monday 12 to Tuesday 13 February 2024


















Specific Areas of Concern Map 4 - Thursday 15 February 2024

Assessment of flood risk



The river flood risk is LOW until Wednesday.

Localised minor river flooding impacts are expected until Wednesday on some slow-responding rivers. Localised minor river flooding impacts are possible more widely across England today and tomorrow as rivers respond to recent rainfall. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps for details.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected across parts of England and Wales on Wednesday and are possible on Thursday. See Specific Areas of Concern Map for details.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is LOW on Monday and Tuesday.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are probable along parts of the South East Wales coast and the River Wye estuary on Monday and Tuesday, and possible more widely on parts of the Wales coasts due to high spring tides. See Specific Areas of Concern Map.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are also possible but not expected around high tide times for parts of the coasts of South West, North West and North East England and the Yorkshire and the Humber coast from today through to Tuesday and the South East coast of Wales on Wednesday.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected today in parts of South East England.

Minor surface water impacts are also possible but not expected across parts of England and Wales on Wednesday and are possible on Thursday due to the potential for widespread heavy rain. See Specific Areas of Concern Map for details.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
