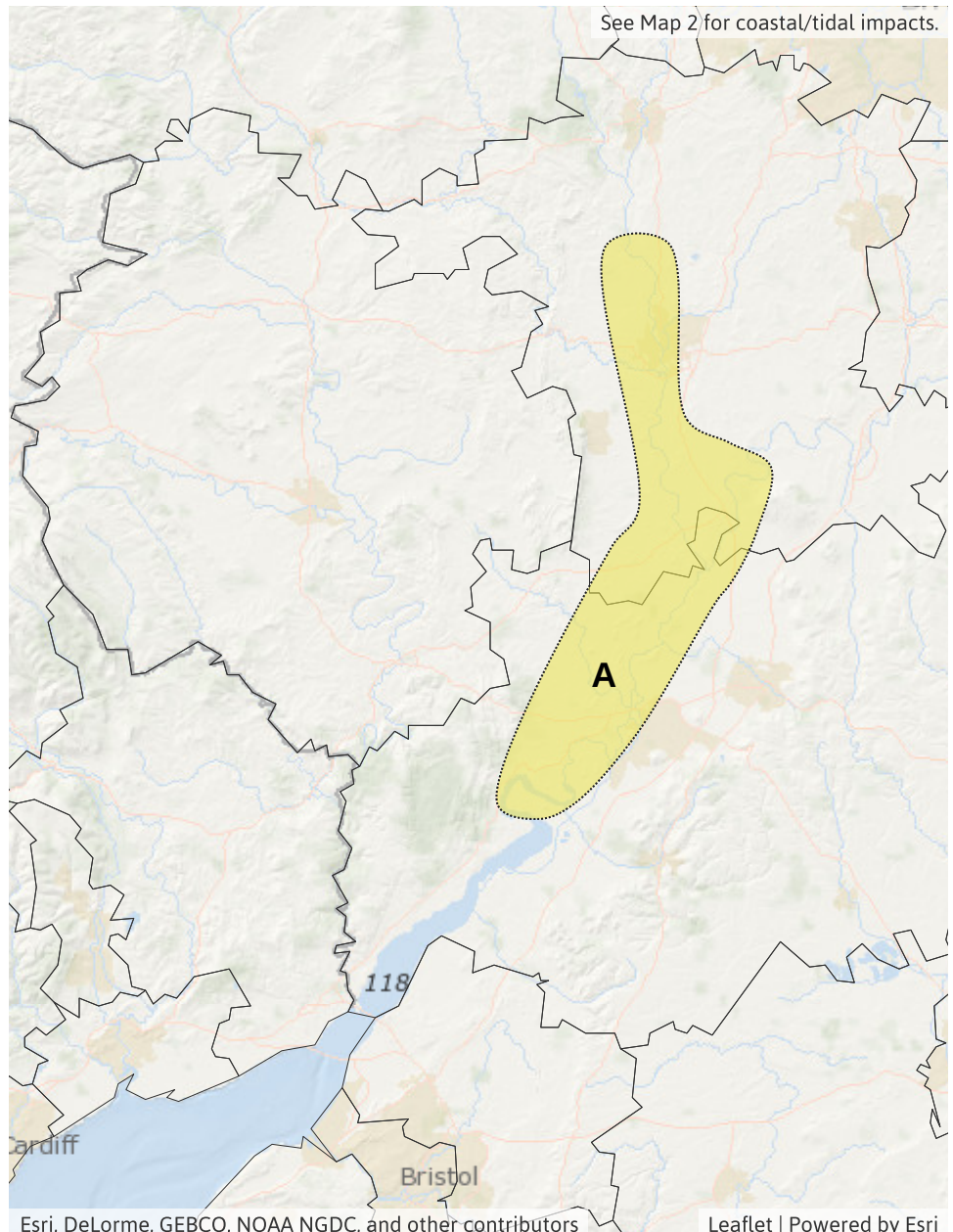

River flooding is expected on the lower River Severn until Wednesday.

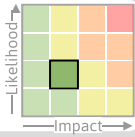

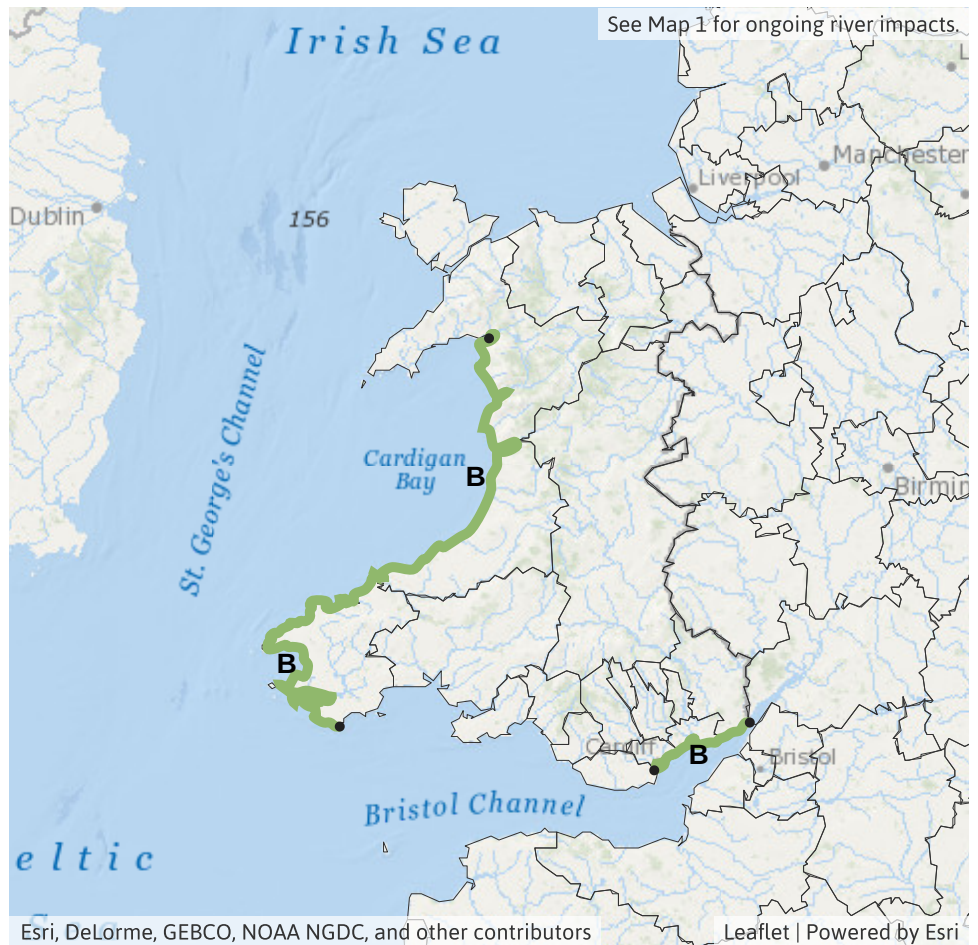

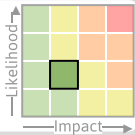
Source Coastal/Tidal

Minor coastal/tidal flooding possible around high tides.



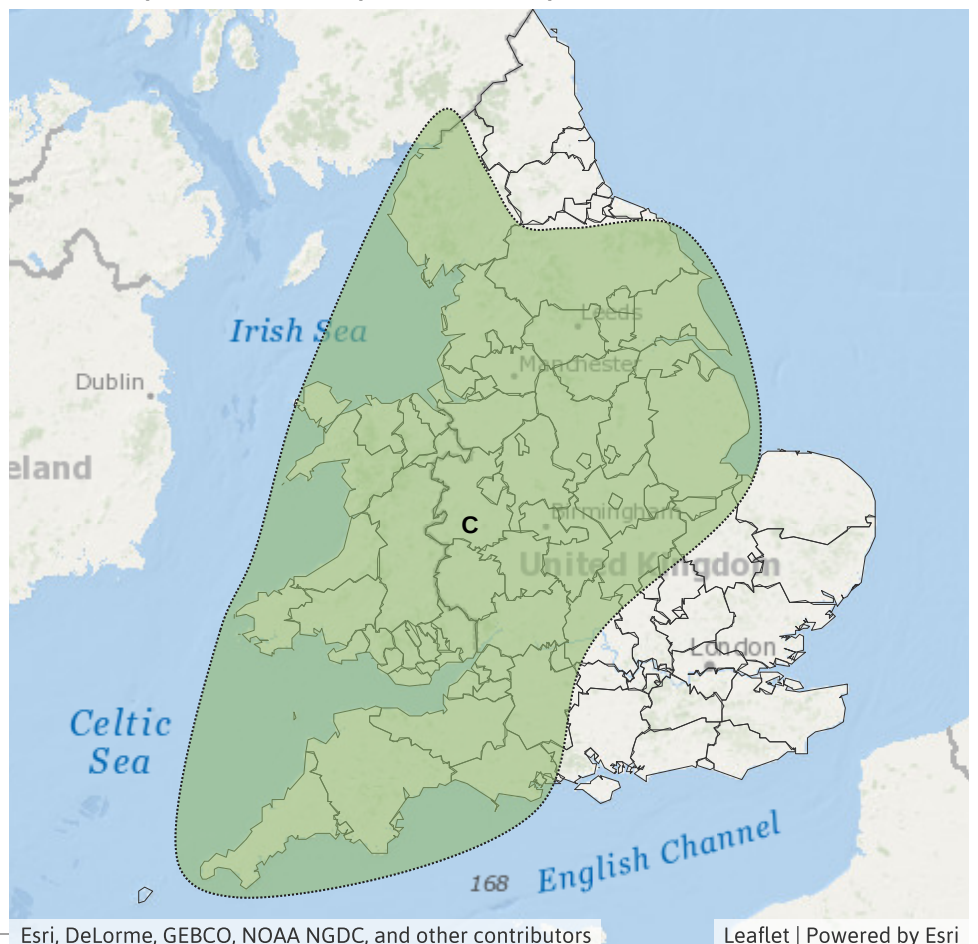
## Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 - Thursday 15 and Friday 16 February 2024

## Assessment of flood risk



### Rivers

The river flood risk is LOW until Wednesday.

Localised minor river flooding impacts are expected until Wednesday along the lower River Severn as it responds to recent rainfall. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 1 for details.

Minor river flooding impacts are possible across parts of England and Wales on Thursday and Friday. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 for details. Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected across England and Wales from Wednesday to Friday.



### Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are possible along parts of the coast of Wales today due to high spring tides. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 2.

Minor coastal flooding impacts are also possible but not expected around high tide times for parts of the North of England coasts today, and the South East coast of Wales on Wednesday.



### Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected across parts of England and Wales on Wednesday and are possible on Thursday due to the potential for widespread heavy rain. See Specific Areas of Concern Map 3 for details.

Impacts could include localised flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



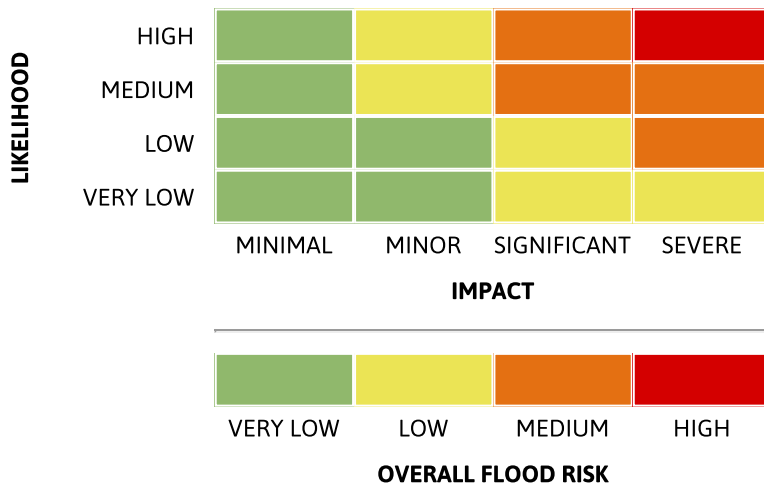
### Groundwater

## Summary of potential impacts

### MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads  
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades  
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

### MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads  
Flooding affecting individual properties  
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

### SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities  
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures  
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

### SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel  
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities  
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure  
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
