


Minor groundwater flooding impacts are probable in parts of the South of England for the next five days. The overall flood risk is LOW.



Assessment of flood risk



The groundwater flood risk is LOW for the next five days.

Minor groundwater flooding impacts are probable across parts of Dorset, Wiltshire and Kent until Friday, and across Hampshire for the next five days. See Specific Areas of Concern Maps.

Minor groundwater flooding impacts are also possible but not expected in parts of Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire for the next five days.

The level of the ongoing disruption caused by groundwater flooding in Dorset, Wiltshire and Kent is not forecast to get worse, the flooding is being managed and awareness is high. Consequently the groundwater flood risk is being assessed as VERY LOW in Dorset, Wiltshire and Kent from Saturday.



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



The river flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads Flooding affecting individual properties Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel Widespread flooding affecting whole communities Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure Large scale evacuation of properties possible
