

Significant inland flooding impacts are probable in parts of Wales today (Sunday) and into Monday, and possible in parts of the South West of England. The overall flood risk for England and Wales is MEDIUM.

Impact **SIGNIFICANT**
Likelihood **MEDIUM**

Significant inland flooding impacts probable due to prolonged heavy rain.

Impact **SIGNIFICANT**
Likelihood **LOW**




Source River Surface

Heavy rain over high ground may lead to significant flooding impacts.

Impact **SIGNIFICANT**
Likelihood **LOW**




Source River Surface

Significant surface water flooding possible, minor river flooding impacts probable.

RISK AREA D

Impact **MINOR**
Likelihood **MEDIUM**




Source River Surface

Heavy rain over high ground may lead to minor flooding impacts.


RISK AREA E

Impact **MINOR**
Likelihood **LOW**

Likely duration 2 Days

Possible localised inland flood impacts on Sunday and Monday from heavy rain.



Assessment of flood risk



Surface water

The surface water flood risk is MEDIUM today (Sunday) and tomorrow.

Heavy and persistent rain, especially in upland areas, through Sunday and into Monday brings the potential for surface water flooding impacts across parts of England and Wales. See Specific Areas of Concern Map.

More widely, minor surface water flooding impacts are possible but not expected across England and Wales today and on Monday and again on Wednesday and Thursday.

Impacts could include flooding from urban and fast responding smaller watercourses/catchments, drains, channels and flooding from overland flow.



Rivers

The river flood risk is MEDIUM today (Sunday) and tomorrow.

Heavy and persistent rain, especially in upland areas, brings the potential for river flooding impacts across parts of England and Wales on Sunday and Monday. See Specific Areas of Concern Map.

Minor river flooding impacts are also possible but not expected more widely across England and Wales today and on Monday and again on Wednesday and Thursday.



Groundwater

The groundwater flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.




Coastal/Tidal

The coastal/tidal flood risk is VERY LOW for the next five days.

Flood risk matrix



Summary of potential impacts

MINIMAL

Isolated and minor flooding of low-lying land and roads
Isolated spray/wave on coastal promenades
Little or no disruption to travel, but wet road surfaces

MINOR

Localised flooding of land and roads
Flooding affecting individual properties
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SIGNIFICANT

Flooding affecting parts of communities
Possible danger to life and damage to buildings/structures
Disruption to travel and key sites in flood plans

SEVERE

Danger to life, severe disruption to travel
Widespread flooding affecting whole communities
Widespread disruption or loss of infrastructure
Large scale evacuation of properties possible
